Charles Dickens once wrote, 'It was the best of times, it was the worst of times.....' and I believe that sums up where we are at in mortgage banking today!

While we are experiencing unprecedented numbers of applications, with the latest figures from the national MBA showing that purchase volume is up 20% from a year ago and refinances up 80%, we are also continuing to see a tremendous number of mortgage loans, estimated at 3.7M, in forbearance. The good news on the forbearance number is that it has gone down now for 8 weeks in a row! Some other good news from MBA last week was that, for the first time in 8 months, their Mortgage Credit Availability Index went up, meaning that credit requirements started loosening.



As we go forward into the later stages of 2020, we will continue to work on keeping you informed in regard to the market nationally and around the state. Also, as we are unable to have meetings in person in the short-run, we are not only utilizing webinar and meeting technologies for the state events Bryan lists above (convention and Future Leaders), we recently conducted training with some of our chapter leaders so they can start planning virtual chapter meetings as well.
